Do you need help with rent and utilities?*

WHAT IS THE EMERGENCY RENTAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM?

The County of Sonoma Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP) helps eligible households who have been financially impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. The program provides payment assistance for renters behind on rent and utilities.



WHAT IS THE ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA?

- Household income must be at or below 80% area median income, \$90,900 for a family of four, as determined by the Federal Department of Housing and Urban Development.
- Household must have experienced a financial hardship directly or indirectly related to COVID-19.
- Household is at risk of experiencing homelessness or housing instability.
- Household is currently receiving rental subsidies such as Section 8, rapid re-housing assistance, or rental assistance from non-profit agencies may apply to cover their portion of rent.
 - ERAP assistance cannot duplicate the assistance the household is currently receiving.

CAN I APPLY IF I AM UNDOCUMENTED?

- Yes, anyone that is eligible may apply regardless of immigration status.
